

MINUTES MARSING CITY COUNCIL MEETING-MARSING CITY HALL-MARSING, IDAHO-DECEMBER 11, 2013-7:00P.M.

Mayor Keith Green called the Meeting to order at 7:00 P.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL: Mayor Keith Green, Aron Streibel, James Ferdinand, Stella Bush, Chris Even, Attorney Stephanie Bonney, City Engineer Amy Woodruff and Annie Campbell, Deputy City Clerk. Also present: Loren and Robin Bailey, Karen Bresnahan, Cory Percifield, Jade and Kenny Black.

CONSENT AGENDA: Streibel moved, Ferdinand seconded to approve the Consent agenda and claims against the City in the amount of \$43,759.97. Motion carried.

PUBLIC INPUT: none

NEW BUSINESS: Mayor Green has concerns about roosters within the City limits. Some people do not hood their roosters as required by Nuisance Ordinance NO.A173, and this is a problem for many. There was also the concern for possible game rooster problems arising. Ferdinand moved, Streibel seconded to have this ordinance amended or revised to eliminate any roosters in the City Limits. Motion carried. City Attorney Bonney will see about this revision of the ordinance.

Elite Systems, Inc., an AC and furnace service company, owned by Loren and Robin Bailey from Kuna, came to meet the Council and see about getting their business application approved. They are leasing the former video store owned by Ken and Jade Black, and will have a showroom and will do mostly service calls, no construction. Streibel moved, Even seconded the approval of this business license. Motion carried.

Engineer Woodruff began discussion on the Park Waterways, and will be sending out letters for support and getting an application ready to go for these improvements.

Engineer Woodruff had a brief update on the Family Dollar Store. They need to solve the ponding problem on Highway 55, in front of the store before they receive a certificate of occupancy from the Building Inspector.

Lastly, Engineer Woodruff told the Council of a grant opportunity for the construction of sidewalks that she feels the City should see about. Some discussion was held on sidewalk improvements and the need for more sidewalks in town.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CONTRACT- Brief discussion was held on this contract but Attorney Bonney had gone over it and will make a few changes in the wording only, not in the content.

Keith talked about an incident that happened near the bank as a truck had been parked near the bank for a number of days. Even responded about this incident that the truck was parked legally and he could do nothing further.


LIQUOR LICENSES: Ferdinand moved, Streibel seconded to approve all the liquor licensed listed on the Agenda. Approved by Council were: Alejandra's, the Pour House, the Sandbar Riverhouse, Logan's Market, Caba's Lounge and the Spot Pizza. Motion carried.

Kubota Purchase: Burke Tractor had a quote for the pricing of a 2013 Kubota RTV for the Maintenance department for the price of \$14,100. Ferdinand asked if there was a guarantee with this and there will be one for 1 yr. Ferdinand moved, Streibel seconded the purchase of the Kubota. Motion carried.

Christmas Hams were ordered to be given to the City employees and other city officials. The Council had been emailed on this for approval. Even moved, Ferdinand seconded to buy these hams. Motion carried.

Ferdinand moved, Streibel seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 7:20 P.M.
